Q: What is included in the Ladakh bike trip package?

A typical Ladakh bike trip package includes bike rental (usually a Himalayan 410cc/450cc), fuel, accommodation on a double or triple sharing basis, meals as per the itinerary, a backup vehicle, mechanic, oxygen cylinder, permits (ILPs), and pickup and drop-off from Leh Airport.

Q: What is the budget for a Ladakh bike trip?

A:

The Ladakh bike trip budget depends on the route and inclusions. A Leh to Leh bike trip package usually starts around ₹25,000–₹35,000, while a Manali to Ladakh bike trip can range from ₹35,000–₹50,000 per person. Costs may vary based on the bike, stay, and group size.

Q: How do I plan a Ladakh trip by bike?

Planning a Ladakh trip by bike begins with selecting your route: either the Leh to Leh circuit or the more adventurous Manali to Ladakh bike trip. The ideal time to go is between May and September, when the roads are open and the weather is favourable.
