On the other side lies Sissu, a quiet Himalayan hamlet set against the backdrop of the Pir Panjal Range. Known for its pristine landscapes, glacial streams, and tranquil ambience, Sissu provides a peaceful retreat far from the usual tourist paths. The Manali Sissu package combines the best of popular attractions and hidden gems, perfect for those seeking both excitement and serenity in the Himalayas.

Places to visit in Sissu

Sissu, nestled in the scenic Lahaul Valley, is a destination where nature, culture, and serenity come together. As part of the ****Manali Sissu package****, here are the top places you won't want to miss:

Sissu Waterfall (Palden Lhamo Dhar)

One of Sissu's most iconic landmarks, this breathtaking, heart-shaped waterfall tumbles down

rocky cliffs beside the Chandra River. You can reach it via a short 20–30 minute trek or enjoy an exciting zipline ride from the helipad area. The mist, greenery, and mountain air make this a refreshing escape.

Sissu Lake

Ghepan Lake Trek

For the adventure-loving traveller, this moderately challenging trek leads to a high-altitude glacial lake at about 14,000 feet. Blanketed in wildflowers and untouched by the crowds, Ghepan Lake is not just scenic, but considered sacred and lucky by locals.

Gyephang Temple (Raja Ghepan Temple)

Dedicated to the guardian deity of Lahaul, this revered temple holds deep spiritual significance. While visitors usually worship from outside the sanctum, the surrounding tranquillity and cultural vibe offer a humbling experience.

Monasteries of Lahaul

Close to Sissu, you'll find a collection of peaceful Buddhist monasteries like Kardang, Shashur, Labrang, Tayul, and Guru Ghantal. These hilltop gompas offer stunning views, spiritual quiet, and rich glimpses into Himalayan Buddhist life.

Gondhla Fort

Located about 18 km from Sissu, this centuries-old fort, built of wood and stone, overlooks the Chandra River. It provides a peaceful, offbeat excursion and insights into Lahaul's royal heritage.

Keylong & Local Markets

Just 30 km away, Keylong is the cultural and commercial heart of the region. Visit the vibrant weekly markets to shop for woollens and handicrafts, or taste local specialities like siddu and dham. It also serves as a hub for accessing nearby monasteries and valleys.

Adventure & Experiences in Sissu

Camping & Stargazing: Camp near Sissu Lake or the waterfall and enjoy clear, star-filled skies. The Milky Way is often visible on cloudless nights.

Ziplining: Fly across the Chandra River on a zipline from the helipad, an exhilarating way to reach the waterfall.

Village Walks & Nature Trails: Stroll through traditional Lahauli villages, observe local farming life, and discover peaceful riverside trails that lead to beautiful viewpoints.

Scenic Drives & Side Trips: Extend your adventure to nearby gems like Baralacha Pass, Pattan Valley, Udaipur (Himachal), Jispa, Tandi, or even toward Spiti Valley along the stunning Manali Leh Highway.

Itinerary •

Day 1: Delhi to Manali | Dist: 529 km | Time: 12 to 14 hr | Altitude: 300 m to 2050 m

- You'll begin your journey with an evening departure from Delhi, travelling by cab or Volvo bus through scenic landscapes on your way to Manali.
- Expect the journey to last between 10 and 14 hours, with arrival scheduled the following

day.

Night: Overnight journey by Volvo Bus or Cab

Day 2: Exploring Manali | Check-In: 11:00 am | Sightseeing: 2:00 pm to 6:00 pm

- Once you arrive in Manali, check into your hotel and take some time to settle in.
- In the afternoon, your cab will take you on a sightseeing tour of Manali's main attractions, including Mall Road, Hadimba Temple, Van Vihar, Old Manali, the Museum, and the Clubhouse.

Night: Stay at the Hotel in Manali

Day 3: Solang Valley, Atal Tunnel and Sissu | Sightseeing Time: 10:00 am to 6:00 pm

- After breakfast, leave for Sissu, a picturesque town nestled in the Lahaul Valley.
- Along the way, you'll pass through the stunning Solang Valley and drive through the Atal Tunnel: the world's longest highway tunnel located above 10,000 feet.
- After reaching Sissu, we will visit Sissu Lake and Sissu Waterfall.
- Later, we will head back to Manali.

FAQs •

Q: What is the temperature in Manali throughout the year?

A: In summer, it's 10°C to 25°C; in winter, it drops to -5°C or lower.

Q: What is the weather in Sissu like?

A: Sissu is colder than Manali, with winter temperatures as low as -10°C.

Q: When is the best time to visit Manali and Sissu?

A: The best time is from May to October for pleasant weather and clear roads.

Q: Does it snow in Sissu?

A: Yes, heavy snowfall occurs from December to February.

Q: Is July a good time to visit Sissu?

A: Yes, but monsoon rains can cause landslides-check road conditions in advance.

Q: How far is Sissu from Manali?

A: About 40 km via the Atal Tunnel, roughly 1.5–2 hours by road.

Q: Can I take a bus from Manali to Sissu?

A: Yes, HRTC runs buses from Manali to Sissu during the summer months.

Q: Are private taxis available from Manali to Sissu?

A: Yes, taxis are available and cost around ₹2,500–₹3,500 for a round trip.

Q: How to reach Sissu from Delhi?

A: Travel to Manali by Volvo or car, then take a taxi or bus through the Atal Tunnel to Sissu.

Q: Is self-driving to Sissu safe?

A: Yes, but you should be experienced in mountain driving, especially during snow or rain.

Q: Are there tour packages from Delhi to Manali and Sissu?

A: Yes, starting from ₹9,000-₹14,000 for 4-6 day packages.

Q: Can I book a combined Manali, Sissu, and Kasol package?

A: Yes, these are popular and available for 6–8 days starting from ₹12,000.
